

HIGH SCHOOLS—LIFE ORIENTATION CLASSES





Kgathi Ya Moshate Secondary School

Pastor Koos Basson and Joe Malete started at this school towards the end of the first quarter 2021. They started with the grade 10,11 and 12 classes

Nancy and Comfort officially started at the school in the second quarter and the teachers and learners gave them a warm welcome.



We had to stop 12 classes early because they are preparing for their trial and final exams, so we asked to take the grade 9 classes instead. Nancy and Joe are doing grade 9 and 10 while Comfort is doing 11.

We received a report that they did well in their third quarter results, and the teachers really appreciate what we are doing. The learners are responding well to us and they are excited about the opportunity to go The LAND, which is our ultimate goal.

Every time we go to classes they always ask 'when are we going to The LAND?". We are still having a challenge to get these learners there, because most of them are not from the same area as the school they attend. Some of them are using transport to get to school. We were planning to take them to The LAND after school hours, but due to distance and these transport issue, it has not yet been possible.

Mmadikana High school-Life Orientation (LO)

We approached the school and after a few follow ups they allowed us in. We are with grade 9,10 and 11, as we could not get the grade 12s because they finished with their LO in the third quarter so we will start with the grade 12s in the new year.

Both the learners and teachers are responding to us positively and we have had a good start at this school. The school is not far from The LAND so we are hoping to get them to The LAND early next year for Adventure Based Leadership Training.

Maruda Christian School (Life Skills)



We are doing Life Skills classes and Physical Education at Maruda Christian School with grades 4-7. We teach them using the outcomes prescribed by the Basic department of Education, but from a Christian perspective.

We also hosted the school staff at The LAND for their team building training. They hiked to the waterfall and we did team building activities with them at the top of the waterfall and they really enjoyed it. They also did the team building obstacles at The LAND.



Their response was really good because for some, it was their first time hiking and doing team building activities.

The team will be doing First Aid 1 and 2 over December in preparation for receiving children at the LAND next year.


BUILDING PROJECT—
KITCHEN AND DINING HALL

The RaN Foundation raised some money for us to start building the Kitchen/Lecture/ Dining room block.

We are starting to build the kitchen/ dining hall/ lecture hall to floor height after which we will pour the floor and commence building.

KENYA

REPORT ON ILLERET FROM TONY ONYANGO

This report is given by Tony Onyango, the son of Nathan Onyango. I, Koos, have had a vision to go to Illeret for some time now, but covid and the chest infection has hindered my taking a team to this remote region in Northern Turkana. We paid for Nathan and Tony to pioneer this area on our behalf.

They set out, as you will read, on a long and arduous journey which was also dangerous because of bandits on certain parts of the route. They needed to pick up an armed police escort at one point to protect them on the journey. Praise God they arrived without incident.

Tony writes: "Greetings from the team sent for Illeret Mission deep down the harsh climatic zone and far beyond Chalbi Desert via North Horr Kenya. We made a very long journey from Eldoret (Pastor Nathan Onyango and Tony Onyango) and Nairobi, (Pastor Maria) respectively.

Our mission was to teach and train pastors and church leaders using IMD Africa's Back to Basics curriculum and to teach on the importance of making Disciples for our Lord Jesus Christ and to ensure that salvation is properly understood. Our methods were: Night cinema, (Gospel cinema), day seminar where we trained using the mentioned curriculum and during early evening hours we also visited homes, doing door to door praying for the sick and those who had different challenges. Some received Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour, some got to have their Faith in Christ restored.

Pastor Maria was the pastor who has faithfully labored in this area for several years. We found out that most ministries started there initially had not continued because of war, cattle rustling, political instability and hard terrain with transport being super expensive, and the roads unpredictability from attack, especially from the Gabra and Dassanite communities from Ethiopia.

There is a huge need of water here as you move further away from Lake Turkana. This is a low rainfall area making the growing of crops is difficult in the region. Lets continue in the prayers that the people in Illeret and those from Ethiopia that attended the training would continue to grow in their faith and leadership.

Please pray for those who received Christ to become part of the church and to grow in their new found faith, regardless of any challenges and temptations that they may face."

All in all a successful mission to this outlying area. Thanks so much to Tony and his Father Nathan for taking up this challenge.

ZAMBIA

I was hoping to go, but this persistent bacteria in my lungs prevented me from traveling. But praise God for men like Henry, Boiler and Milan who could take up the slack and help finish the job.

Thanks to everyone who contributed to this effort. The church in Puta in Northern Zambia, Congo and Muwele region are really grateful for how the body of Christ came together to help.
